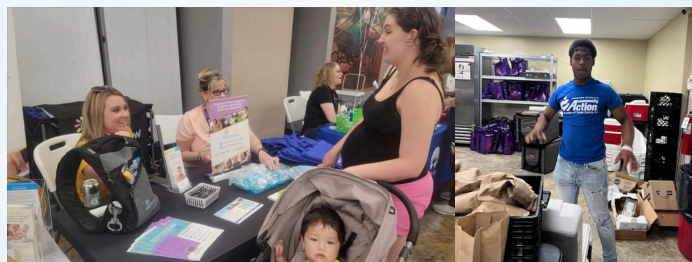


Workforce Solutions and Community Development

- Individuals in workforce services – 773 Adults and Youth served, including 210 receiving vehicle repair services
- 267 Participants Entering Employment
- Pathways clients – 154 new and expectant mothers
- Creative Cubs – 55 enrolled, age 6 weeks and older – Silver Step Up to Quality rating
- Smoking Cessation goals – Enhanced Programming to broader population (including policy marketing and outreach)
- Fatherhood- The Fatherhood program staff served 133% more fathers, increased categorical success by 142%, and exited 588% more fathers than the previous year
- Work completed on 4 parks with two more in progress
- Summer meals – 150,101 meals at 26 open feeding sites
- Snacks and Dinners provided for at risk youth locations – 24858 meals (8 open feeding sites)
- Scioto County WIC caseload – 1612 (Women, Infants and Children)
- 1084 Breastfeeding Contacts
- Breastfeeding Initiation Rate – 41%
- 104 Cribettes, 90 Car Seats, 280 Diapers, 365 Wipes, \$3500 in Gas Cards distributed



Social Services

- Senior Nutrition Program - 75915 home delivered meals and 3547 congregate meals
- HEAP - 3053 households served
- PIPP, Summer and Winter Crisis - 6285 applications completed for households in Scioto County
- Mobile Hygiene Unit - 501 total visits for the shower and laundry services
- Emergency Services - 164 households served for the amount of \$72,230.84

Energy Solutions

- Home Weatherization: 50 households served with sealing, insulation, furnace repair or replacement, hot water repair or replacement, and 10 roofs
- 425 energy audits, LED bulb upgrades, and shower, refrigerator, or freezer replacements
- Columbia Gas WarmChoice Program: 140 households served
- AEP Ohio Help Assessments - 100 households served

Early Childhood

- Served a total of 422 pregnant women and children ages 0-5
- 10 centers available throughout the county
- Providing both center-based and home-based options
- 6,149 Home Visits completed - 1427 Head Start and 4722 Early Head Start
- 129 children transitioned to area kindergartens
- 85% of Early Head Start children and 73% of Head Start children received a dental exam
- 96% of Early Head Start children as well as 93% of Head Start children completed a medical exam this year
- 98% of Head Start children and 80% of Early Head Start are up to date on their immunizations
- Early childhood served 61,547 breakfasts, lunches, & snacks during the school year
- 71 events for families as well as the community
- 2,665 guests welcomed
- Families & community volunteers spent 39,678 hours in our centers
- 6 million dollars invested in local community
